

Single Family Rating

The number of sustainability measures a project incorporates determines its star rating.

Basic Requirements	1-Star
25 – 49 30 - 54 pts	2-Star
50 – 74 55 – 79 pts	3-Star
75 – 99 80 – 104 pts	4-Star
100 105 pts or more	5-Star







Single Family 2023 New Basic Requirements

Energy Performance

• Updated the minimum percentage above code requirement to 8%

HVAC Efficiency and Design

- Updated to new SEER2 and HSPF2 federal standards and increased efficiency requirements for HVAC equipment
- Gas furnace minimum increased to 90 AFUE
- Requiring static pressure testing port installation

Indoor Environmental Quality

• Updated to require emissions-based standard instead of VOC content

Embodied Carbon Reduction

• New requirement

Landscaping

 Changed WaterSense controller requirement to align with pressure regulation

Homeowner Education

• Added builder resource document

Electric Vehicle Readiness

 Updated measure to align with proposed 2024 IECC code language



Education and Site

Planning for Green Building

• Added new measure to strengthen green building project planning and better achieve green building goals

Green Building Education

• Added an option for attending on-demand offerings by AEGB

Local Food Production and Healthy Food Access

• Added new measure to align with Austin Climate Equity Plan to increase on-site food production and access to healthy food in Austin







Energy and Water

High Performance Systems

Revised to accommodate new HVAC technology

Water Heater Efficiency

- Revised to align with ENERGY STAR[®] v5
- Added demand response capability requirement for electric resistance storage water heater option

Water Heating Design

 Added points for leak detection and a smart water valve

Indoor Water Conservation

• Now a 2-star requirement









Health

Low Emitting Products (2-star requirement)


- Split out from improved air quality to emphasize the importance of healthy building materials
- Added points including a point for using products with Health Product Declarations

Red List-Free Products

 New measure to minimize the use of products that expose humans to the known harmful classes of chemicals

Extreme Temperature Resilience

• New measure to promote safer and more resilient construction in the context of severe weather events

Embodied Carbon Reduction

• New measures moved from the innovation guide

Lower Greenhouse gas refrigerants

• New measure to promote the phase out of hydrofluorocarbons (HFC) to reduce greenhouse gas emissions



80 pts or more	5-Star





Multifamily 2023 New Basic Requirements

Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure

• New basic requirement that 40% of parking provided be a minimum of EV capable

Concrete Quantity

 New basic requirement to track and report all concrete quantities used on the project

Resident Recycling and Construction Waste Management

• Now part of City code, so no longer a basic requirement





Energy and Water

Lower Greenhouse Gas Refrigerants


 New points for equipment using refrigerants with lower global warming potential

Grid Flexibility

 2-4 points available for strategies that support demand response programs and improve electric grid system reliability

Leak Detection

Previous Innovation point brought into rating





Health

Healthier Material Selection

 New points for using products participating in material ingredient transparency labelling programs and for products earning improved material health designations such as Declare LBC Red List Free products

Antimicrobial Avoidance

 New point for avoiding products with added antimicrobials that are marketed with claims of being beneficial to human health

PVC Reduction

- New points available for using HDPE pipe for wastewater and irrigation piping
- Points moved from materials section to Health section for better alignment and emphasis

Embodied Carbon Reduction

 New points for incorporating practices to allow project teams to better understand embodied carbon impacts of building materials

Compost Collection

• Previously an innovation measure

Sustainably Sourced Materials

 No longer offering these points in favor of a more wholistic approach to evaluating building materials and their impacts







Site

Intentional Site Selection

- Removed points for Environmental Sensitivity and Desired Development
- Added point for avoiding prime farmland
- Brownfield point consolidated under this measure

Resilience – Designated Areas

 New points to provide space in the complex that offers day-to-day services and supports the community before, during and after a disaster

Enhance Tree Canopy Cover

• New point to promote increased tree canopy cover

Construction Worker Equity

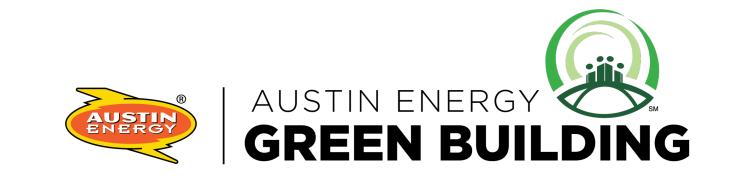
