A motion to recommend the Parks and Recreation Department (PARD) Climate Vulnerability Analysis and Management Strategies was made on Commissioner Bristol's motion, Commissioner Ramberg's second.

Commissioner Brimer's amendment to add "using the best technology of the time, prescribed burn notification should go to all residents within a mile of the burn and within 30 days; with specific burn date notification happening within 3 days depending on weather" failed when it was not seconded.

Commissioner Cofer's amendments to "Incorporate additional ways to improve soil health and increase ground hydration in future associated work plans, ensure work plans include measurable monitoring efforts to detect and correct for any adverse effects of management activities such as prescribed burns and tree thinning, and remove use of toxic herbicides except to control invasive, non-native species, identify alternatives for pesticide application, and consider additions to the 2017 PARD Integrated Pest Management Plan that take sensitive karst features into consideration," seconded by Commissioner Sullivan, were added to the original motion with no opposition. Commissioners Krueger and Nickells were absent.

Commissioner Bristol's motion with Commissioner Cofer's amendments passed on a 8-0 vote. Commissioner Brimer abstained. Commissioners Krueger and Nickells were absent.

Chair Ramberg called for a recess at 8:57 pm. Chair Ramberg reconvened the meeting 9:05 pm.

6. Discussion and possible action regarding a recommendation to Austin City Council to eliminate parking on the Zilker Park Polo Field and expand the Zilker Park Shuttle – Requested and presented by Commissioner Brimer

A motion to extend the meeting until 10:15 P.M. was approved on Commissioner Ramberg's motion, Commissioner Bedford second on a 8-0 vote. Commissioner Bristol recused. Commissioners Krueger and Nickells were absent.

A motion to postpone this item until a near future meeting to coordinate with PARD and better understand the cause and effects of closing the Polo Field passed on Commissioner Ramberg's motion, Commissioner Einhorn's second, on a 8–0 vote. Commissioner Bristol recused. Commissioners Krueger and Nickells were absent.
