Overview


- Original terminal constructed in 1999
 - \$585 million budget (\$1.04 billion in 2022 dollars)
 - 25 gates
 - 126 daily flights
 - Designed to serve 11 million annual passengers
- 2019 expansion
 - \$350 million budget
 - Added 175,000 square feet
 - 9 new gates Total 34 gates
 - Designed to serve 15 million annual passengers
- 2022 Growth
 - 21.1 million annual passengers served
 - Designed to serve 15 million annual passengers

Much of the original infrastructure is meeting its End of Life






AUS has achieved record high passenger levels

AUS compared to peer airports




- AUS is now classified as a large-hub airport by the Federal Aviation Administration.
- Competing with large airports Air Service.
- Large-hub category is more competitive for federal dollars and we are a new and smaller player vying against major airport for federal funds.





Contract Outreach

Objectives

- Conduct Contractor/Consultant focused outreach to encourage participation in procurements [at least one quarterly]
 - Three (3) anticipated for 3rd Quarter Pre Industry Day Focused Outreach Series- Are You Ready? Get Set. Let's Go!!
- Attend stakeholder and diverse industry-sponsored events in addition to partnering with them to conduct outreach to their members [at least 4 per month]
 - Seven (7) completed for the month of July and over 30 events for the 3rd Quarter
- Conduct outreach to firms that are not City-Certified but are certified by other entities, e.g., State of Texas HUBs, MSDC MBEs and WBEIC WBEs to support the SMBR Certification Team for a 30% increase in the pool of certified firms in scopes needed for AEDP work. Current increase of 3% in one quarter.



Workforce Development

- AEDP will make commercially reasonable efforts for 30% of the project's
 overall workforce are sourced from local workforce initiatives and
 organizations, educational institutions and industry programs which reflect the diverse
 and inclusive culture of the greater Austin area.
- AEDP will make commercially reasonable efforts for **30% of the project's <u>construction</u> workforce** are sourced from local DOL-registered apprenticeship programs, local workforce initiatives or DOL-approved craft training programs that offer hands-on instruction at no cost or nominal cost to the worker through such initiatives such as the Better Builder program especially the COA' Living Wage requirements and OSHA training
