PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1963 house.

ARCHITECTURE

Two-story brick house with Ranch stylistic influences.

RESEARCH

The house at 1800 Ferdinand Street was built in 1963. Its first occupants were Lawrence Brown, Jr., and his wife, Gladys. Lawrence Brown, a Korean War veteran and recipient of the Combat Infantry Badge in 1952, worked as a clerk for the Internal Revenue Service throughout the 1960s and 1970s.

PROPERTY EVALUATION


The 2016 East Austin Historic Resource Survey lists the property as contributing to a potential historic district.


Designation Criteria—Historic Landmark

- 1) The building is more than 50 years old.
- 2) The building appears to retain high integrity.
- 3) Properties must meet two criteria for landmark designation (LDC §25-2-352). Staff has evaluated the property and determined that it does not meet two criteria:
 - a. Architecture. The building does not appear to convey architectural significance.
 - b. Historical association. The property does not appear to have significant historical associations.
 - c. Archaeology. The property was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
 - d. Community value. The property does not appear to possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
 - e. Landscape feature. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package.
