**ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** In early 2023 the Transportation and Public Works Department (TPW) was awarded \$22,866,000 through the US Department of Transportation's (USDOT) Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grant program. Staff are requesting Council appropriate the federal grant funds which will be fully reimbursed by USDOT as grant funds are expended over the five year timeframe of the grant agreement. Staff are also requesting a budget amendment to transfer funds from the TPW Fiscal Year 2023 operating budget to account for a portion of the required local match.

Following approval of the grant agreement and appropriation of funds, TPW staff will refine project locations and begin pursuing new contracts with consultants or vendors, as needed, to implement the project over the five-year timeframe of the grant.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the department's need for continuing funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
