### **Additional Backup Information:**

Austin Water's Wildland Conservation Division (AW WCD) manages over 25,000 acres of public lands held in trust for endangered species protection and the protection of the Barton Springs recharge and contributing zones. As part of that mandate, AW WCD utilizes prescribed fire as a key land management practice on our Water Quality Protection Lands. The Division works collaboratively with many partners on these efforts, including the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center of the University of Texas at Austin.

The purpose of this agreement is to establish a framework of cooperation for each of the parties to provide mutual support, cooperation and assistance for prescribed fire management, fire prevention, fire preparedness; and for assistance on "all risk" incidents or land management activities where specific skills and/or equipment are required. It will also provide for technical support and training; and will allow each party to request equipment, personnel, and appropriate personal safety items as necessary to ensure the safety of employees participating in interagency incident management efforts. The parties understand that the resources available from the City under this agreement are limited to the resources of Austin Water, Wildland Conservation Division.

This agreement maintains a partnership that has been in place since 2011 and was formally established by interlocal agreement in 2018. This current agreement expands the partnership to include support for additional land management activities beyond prescribed fire, to take advantage of the considerable expertise of both parties.
