Additional Backup Information:

The City of Austin and its other Partners in the Greater Austin-Travis County Regional Radio System (GATRRS) provide leadership for a multi-jurisdictional Project 25 (P25) standard, interoperable 700 MHz / 800 MHz trunked radio communications system. In 2005, a \$6,000,000 federal grant to the City of Austin provided a substantial upgrade to the GATRRS "Master Site," with the stated purpose to include the hosting of other government jurisdiction radio systems into a common wide-area system to improve radio communications interoperability for day-to-day operations, mutual aid, and critical incident operations among government agencies. "Interoperability" is defined by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security as: "the ability of emergency response agencies to talk to one another via communication systems-to exchange voice and/or data with one another on demand, in real time, when needed, and as authorized."

The proposed "Master Site Use Interlocal Agreements" will allow the outside government entities listed below to connect into an interoperable platform. Costs related to connection of the outside entities to the GATRRS Master Site will be borne by the outside entities at no expense to the City of Austin or the other GATRRS Partners, and the outside entities will pay for their own radio system operation and maintenance costs as well as services to be performed by COA at the request of the outside entities.
