Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide sexual assault advocate case reviews of the Austin Police Department's (APD) sexual assault cases opened from January 1, 2021, through December 31, 2022. In September 2019, the City contracted the Police Executive Research Forum, in conjunction with the Women's Law Project and the Wellesley Centers for Women, to undertake a comprehensive assessment of the investigation and processing of sexual assaults reported to APD. The report recommended APD conduct a confidential review of randomly selected sexual assault cases on an annual basis. An annual case review provides on-going insight into the investigation and processing of sexual assault cases and establishes cultural expectations for continuous improvement.

Case reviews are to be conducted on cases that meet the following criteria: closed cases, felony cases, and cases of survivors 18 years of age and older. Case reviews are to be conducted on no less than 20% of the annual average of cases over the two-year period and are expected to involve local community advocates. The reviews will focus on the thoroughness of investigations, the proper coding of crimes, whether the investigations reached appropriate outcomes, and the elimination of bias.

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End Violence Against Women International (EVAW) has been deemed qualified to provide these services based on demonstrated experience and expertise in the investigation and prosecution of adult sexual assault in the United States. EVAW will produce a final report that includes the collection, review, and analysis of available information and stakeholder interviews. This report is expected to be released to the public.

This is a new contract that must be executed before October 1, 2023, to allow adequate funding of services.
