On June 8, 2023, City Council approved Resolution No. 20230608-078, which directed staff to create a six month pilot program that extends certain deadlines related to zoning and rezoning applications. The pilot program's objective is to extend the period designated for project due diligence and negotiations, thereby mitigating potential zoning case expirations and associated fees if applicants need to resubmit. Additionally, the program aims to enhance predictability for public hearings, ensuring a more efficient approach for community stakeholders. This pilot program will also coordinate zoning and rezoning applications with neighborhood plan amendment applications by extending certain deadlines, promoting a coordinated application process. The proposed deadline extensions for zoning, rezoning, and neighborhood plan amendment applications are as follows:

- (1) The deadline for a Land Use Commission to hold a public hearing after an application is filed would be 120 days.
- (2) The deadline for City Council to hold a public hearing after the Land Use Commission makes a

recommendation would be 80 days.

(3) An application expires 362 days after it is filed if a public hearing before a Land Use Commission has not been scheduled.

An application expires 362 days after it is filed if the Land Use Commission or City Council grants and indefinite postponement.
