## **Community Services Duties**

- Available for appointments and walk in services with unhoused patrons at Central, Terrazas, and Little Walnut libraries
- Make referrals to social services providers and connect unhoused patrons to essential services like: food, shelter, temporary/permanent housing, employment services, clothing, hygiene needs, eligible benefits, and healthcare
- Receive referrals from staff, external service providers, and word of mouth among the unhoused community
- Coordinate service providers in branches

## Issues

- Library use policies problematic for unhoused patrons
  - No clothing, no shoes
  - Belongings, no storage
  - Sleeping
  - CTNs
- Unhoused patrons visit all of our locations
- Increase in urgent mental health care needs
- Increase in substance abuse

## Supports

- Small budget for fees like IDs
- Budget for hygiene, harm reduction, and basic needs for library use like reading glasses and shoes
- Hosting social services providers in libraries for more direct and faster services
- In house social workers/interns
- Additional Community Services Coordinators
