Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of a contract for a cloud-based cellular school zone beacon management system with Paradigm Traffic Systems Inc. d/b/a Paradigm Traffic Systems, for a term of five years in an amount not to exceed \$2,000,000.

Additional Backup Information:

The contract will provide the Transportation and Public Works Department with a cloud-based cellular school zone beacon system enabling the City's Mobility Management Center (MMC) to manage remotely, monitor, and troubleshoot school zone beacons. The system resolves the limitations of the current radio-based system, eliminating line-of-sight communication issues and outdated hardware. It supports concurrent users, enhancing productivity and efficiency in monitoring and programming school zone beacons. Additionally, the system incorporates real-time power status monitoring features, empowering the MMC to swiftly address power-related issues, ensuring the safety and efficiency of school zones throughout the City.

The Houston-Galveston Area Council cooperative is a cooperative purchasing association recognized under Texas procurement statutes. Cooperative associations, themselves or using a lead government, competitively solicit and award contracts that are eligible for use by other qualified state and local governments. Due to their substantial volumes, larger than any one government could achieve independently, cooperative contracts

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routinely include superior terms, conditions, and pricing. Use of cooperative contracts also results in lower administrative costs and time savings.
