**ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** The U.S. Health and Human Services Commission (or HHSC) through the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) awarded Austin Public Health funds to initiate a Medical Reserve Corps program. This award supports the establishment of the Austin/Travis County Medical Reserve Corps (or ARCMRC), a local chapter of a national network of medical and public health volunteers, that focuses on supporting public health and medical emergency preparedness and response within the community. The award supports the recruitment, organization, and utilization of health workers, public health professionals, and community volunteers to prepare for and respond to disasters and other public health emergencies. Funding administrative program oversight, recruitment, outreach efforts, preparedness training, and responding to real-world incidents. The total amount of the award is \$47,242 and must be used during state DSHS Fiscal Year 2024 from September 1, 2023 to August 31, 2024.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute additional funds beyond those currently budgeted to this grant. When the grant funds expire, the Austin Public Health Department's need for continued funding will be evaluated and may be denied.
