Mueller Redevelopment

Vision

To create a district that would be a model for responsible urban development to influence the form and pattern of growth within Austin.

Goals

- Fiscal Responsibility
- Diversity & Affordability
- East Austin Revitalization
- Neighborhood Compatibility
- Economic Development
- Sustainability





Mueller Redevelopment – Implementation

- A public-private partnership
- Master Development Agreement between City and Developer
- Developer executes the Redevelopment Plan with City oversight
- Creates a balanced partnership to achieve community social goals, City fiscal return, with developer earning fees







Mueller Redevelopment – Program



Residential 6,900 for-sale & rental homes 1,725 affordable units (25%)



Office 2.4 million sf



Public Parks 140 acres







Civic 350,000 sf



Retail 750,000 sf



Mueller Redevelopment - Parks and Open Space

- 20% of land (140 acres)
- 54% of open space (75 acres) to be dedicated parkland
- Variety of park types and scales with public access easements (regional, neighborhood, urban, and pocket)
- 13 miles of trails
- All parks and open space maintained by the Mueller Property Owner's Association (POA)





Master Development Agreement – Open Space

- MDA set to expire December 2024
- § 8.2 (h) City Park Maintenance Contribution
 - Traditionally the City maintains publicly dedicated open space.
 - The City set ambitious social and economic goals for the construction and maintenance of Mueller's open space .
 - PARD to provide annual payment, subject to annual appropriation, to offset anticipated maintenance costs to the same level as if the City were to retain maintenance responsibilities.
- § 8.8 (c) Public Dedication
 - Perimeter Parks shall be dedicated back to City after construction of Park Infrastructure has been completed.








Northwest Perimeter Park (~13.4 acres)


- Highlighted Amenities:
 - Trellis Structure + picnic tables
 - Playscape + swing set
 - Public Art
 - The Geode by Hunter Cross included in the City's AIPP program
 - Trees (300+)
 - Benches + bike rack
 - Walking trails (DG + concrete), drinking fountains, trash/ recycling/dog stations





Southwest Perimeter Park (~31.0 acres)


- Highlighted Amenities:
 - Public Art
 - Wigwam by Chris Levack
 - Pollen Grain by Chris Levack
 - Arachnophillia by Dixie Friend Gay
 - Trees (575+)
 - Demonstration Gardens
 - Bird habitats
 - Benches + bike rack
 - Walking trails (DG + concrete), drinking fountains, trash/ recycling/dog stations





Southeast Perimeter Park (~30.6 acres)

- Highlighted Amenities:
 - Skate Park + Pump Track
 - Trees (630+)
 - Orchard + herb garden
 - Pedestrian Bridge
 - Benches + bike rack
 - Walking trails (DG + concrete), drinking fountains, trash/ recycling/dog stations





Skate Park + Pump Track

\$2.5M Investment/Highlighted Amenities:

- Restroom, parking lot, canopy shade structures + dumpster enclosure
- Bench seating + bike rack
- Drinking fountain, trash/recycling stations













Mueller PMA Roles and Responsibilities

MUELLER POA (POA)

- Minimum Maintenance
 - Mow all turf areas a min. 32 times per year;
 - Mow all prairie/wildflower/native areas annually; and
 - Conduct annual tree inspections and provide tree care.

• Other Tasks

- To provide routine and preventative maintenance as necessary to keep the Parkland and Skate Park + Pump Track clean, functional, and accessible.
- Maintenance Examples: irrigation, litter control, trail repairs, pest management, general repairs, payment of utilities.
- Submit Annual Report to PARD

THE CITY (PARD)

- Request Annual Funding to POA in PARD Budget
 - General Perimeter Parks Maintenance
 - Skate Park + Pump Track Maintenance
- Annual Contribution to POA
 - Subject to appropriations and City Council Approval
 - General Perimeter Parks Maintenance
 - FY 23-24 (approved): \$144,504 (Northwest and Southwest Perimeter Parks)
 - FY 24-25 (to be requested): Add'l \$55,496 (Southeast Perimeter Park), plus add'l amount (TBD) for Skate Park Maintenance
- Oversight
 - Review Mueller POA Annual Report
 - Annual playground inspections
 - General spot checks



Mueller POA Term Summary

- Parties to the Agreement
 - The City
 - Director of PARD
 - The Mueller POA
 - Mueller POA Community Manager
- Term
 - 20 years
 - After initial period, automatically renews for 5 years every 5 years
- Funding Increase Requests
 - The Mueller POA may request increase in funding once every three years. Request must include relevant backup to justify increase.
 - PARD will review and recommend mutually agreed upon amount

- Change in Use/Program
 - Future Parkland Improvements will be assessed through the City's Community Activated Park Project Program.
 - Prior to Project Approval:
 - Both parties must support improvement.
 - City will be responsible for construction costs/expenses.
 - Maintenance and operation cost to be determined by both parties.
 - Projects must follow Mueller Design Book
