2023 PROGRAMMING RECAP



2023 HIGHLIGHTS

This year marks the 20th Anniversary of The Trail Conservancy (formerly The Trail Foundation). Yet, it is our first full year under our Park Operations and Maintenance Agreement (POMA), with TTC assuming additional operations, maintenance, and programming responsibilities across the 10-mile Butler Trail. Our programming focus has been centered around building community – creating programming that was free and accessible to all ages and abilities and would appeal to the various neighborhoods around the Trail.

TRAIL PROGRAMMING SERIES


 **MUSIC ON THE TRAIL.** Launched in the Fall of 2020, our Music on the Trail series brings Austin's most loved musicians to the Trail for pop-up performances most Saturday mornings throughout the year.

Highlights:

- Partnered with Austin Texas Musicians (ATXM) to book musicians
- Activated Music on the Trail at Kite Festival and Austin Rowing Club's Fitness Festival
 - Hosted 36 musicians at 7 different Trail locations across 14 weeks

Upcoming 2023:

- Resuming series in September, after a summer heat hiatus, with a focus on Hispanic Heritage Month
- Partnering with Heath Alliance for Austin Musicians for HAAM Day on the Trail performances


 **FITNESS ON THE TRAIL.** During the Spring, we continued our free, family-friendly monthly *Flow & Thrive* yoga series led by ATX Yoga Girl Cynthia Bernard. We are rebranding the series for the Fall to *TrailFit*, demonstrating our expansion of fitness offerings.

Highlights:

- Hosted three sessions in the Spring with a total attendance of 51 people

Upcoming 2023:

- Offering an expanded fitness schedule designed for all ages and abilities
- Partnering with Violet Crown Cycling for Kids on Bikes in Parks, an event focusing on imagination in activity (October 21, Festival Beach)
- Hosting Afro-Latin Flow in partnership with the MACC's Latin American Artist Program (LAAP), a drum and dance circle (September 23, TBD)


 **SCAVENGER HUNT.** Due to the success of the Trees of the Trail Scavenger Hunt, launched in 2021, we introduced a new history-themed Scavenger Hunt- History of the Butler Trail- in September. This interactive and self-paced activity is geared toward children and families, providing a fun way to learn about the Trail.



KIDS ADOPT A GARDEN. TTC's Kid's Adopt A Garden program partners with Metz and Camacho Recreation Centers as an addition to their summer camp program. The Adopt A Garden program is designed to provide a space for students to experience the joys of the outdoors while learning about the environment through hands-on activities. The program introduces children to all facets of gardening and ecological concepts through hands-on gardening and interactive activities.

Highlights:


- During ten sessions, we engaged over 400 kids in activities, including planting, weeding, watering, using a microscope, creating wildflower seed balls, and more.

SPECIAL EVENTS

 **EARTH DAY CLEAN-UP (April 21, 2023).** Focusing on highlighting our ecological work around the Butler Trail, we celebrated Earth Day Weekend this year. On Friday, April 21, we partnered with The Rowing Dock for their second annual community land and lake clean-up. The event was free to all community volunteers and raised funds through sponsorships for The Trail Conservancy.

Highlights:

- Picked up 8,000 pounds of trash from around the Trail and in the lake
- 1,400 volunteers participated in the community-wide event

 **EARTH DAY JUBILEE (April 22, 2023 - International Shores).** We hosted our first-ever Earth Day Jubilee at International Shores, celebrating the Butler Trail and the volunteers who

help maintain the Trail. The family-friendly community event was free to attend and featured live music, eco workshops, interactive Earth-friendly activities, a makers' market, food trucks, and hourly giveaways.

Highlights:

- An estimated 1,200 attendees throughout the event
- Engaged 11 community partners who conducted activations and workshops, including the Park Rangers, MACC, Austin Bat Refuge, Austin Resource Recover, Of Color, Central Texas Seed Library, and more



MAUDIE'S MOONLIGHT MARGARITA RUN (June 6, 2023 - Sand Beach Park). Celebrating its 20th Anniversary, Maudie's Moonlight Margarita 5K Fun Run is a long-standing tradition for The Trail Conservancy – and one of our most significant fundraising events each year.



Highlights:

- Hosted our largest attendance for the event to date, with 2,167 registrants and over 1,900 runners
- Added music to the Finish Line Celebration, with Passion Flower Art Car and music by DJ Chorizo Funk



FORTLANDIA (October 2023 – January 2024 – Auditorium Shores).

We are partnering with the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Center for the fourth year to host a satellite fort for their Fortlandia exhibit. This year, we have selected *Wisteria* by artist Shelley McDavid. It is circular and reminiscent of the abstract qualities of a wisteria bush and fence hedge line. The fort is designed to experience from both the interior and exterior via a maze. The satellite fort allows more people to engage and enjoy the Fortlandia exhibit and the Trail's nature.



HALLOWEEN ON THE TRAIL (October 28, 2023 – Seaholm Waterfront/ Shoal Beach)

We celebrate Halloween on the Trail for the first time with a family-friendly, free community Trick-or-Treat event. We will partner with local non-profit and community partners to create a Spooktacular event with pet and child costume contests.



SANTA ON THE TRAIL (December 2, 2023 – International Shores). Santa will return to the Trail for complimentary photos and allow kids of all ages to get their lists in early! This year, we plan to partner with a local makers' market for a holiday shopping experience.

VOLUNTEER PROGRAMMING



SHORELINE STEWARDSHIP. The partnership between Watershed Protection and TTC for the Lady Bird Lake shoreline began in 2015 and was built upon extensive and ongoing work championed by the TTC conservation team. The weekly volunteer program builds upon the principles of restoring and enhancing plant communities, repairing, and improving ecological function, creating resiliency, enhancing the Trail user experience, and facilitating stewardship.

Highlights:

- Hosted 17 Shoreline Stewardship events from January – July
- Engaged 335 volunteers in 49 hours of work
- Included invasive species management, floodplain restoration and land management, and floodplain stewardship

Upcoming 2023:

- The program will resume in September with 11 more events planned through the end of the year

PUBLIC VOLUNTEER DAYS. TTC relies on volunteers to complete many ecological restoration projects along the Butler Trail and the surrounding shoreline. In addition to our public Shoreline Stewardship Days, we offer other community opportunities to volunteer, helping with planting, soil improvement, mulching, trash clean-ups, and invasive species removal.

Highlights:

- Hosted 12 public volunteer events from January – July
- Engaged 2,419 volunteers in 27.5 hours of work
- Included MLK Day of Service, City Nature Challenge Bio-Blitz, a SXSW Clean-Up with Patagonia, Latino Outdoors, and Westlake High School Senior Service Day
- Earth Day Clean-Up produced 8,000 lbs. of trash collected from the land and lake from 2,400 volunteers.

DAY IN THE DIRT. This program is an opportunity for local corporations to get involved, many using it as a corporate team-building day. TTC charges a nominal fee for all Day in the Dirt events to offset expenses and staff time.

Highlights:

- Hosted 15 DITD events from January – July
- Engaged 272 volunteers in 34.5 hours of work
- Participating organizations include Abbott Laboratories, Amazon, Silicon Labs, IntraCorp, Apple, and others

Upcoming 2023:

- We hold Thursday and Friday mornings open for Day in the Dirt requests. We have 21 days available for 2023, with five events currently confirmed.

COMMUNITY TRAIL CLEANUP. We launched this new program in August 2023 based on feedback we received through our 2022 community surveys. This “do-it-yourself” program

allows the community to borrow supplies like trash grabber, gloves, and trash bags and conduct their Trail clean-up.

ARTS + CULTURE PLAN



The Trail Conservancy partnered with the Austin Parks and Recreation Department and Art in Public Places to create an Arts + Culture Plan for the Butler Trail that would contribute to the space and elevate the user experience without overwhelming, distracting, or complicating the environment. That plan was approved by the Austin City Council in May 2023 and introduced to the public shortly after.

ARTS + CULTURE OPEN HOUSE (May 13 – Seaholm Intake Building)

We introduced the Plan to the community with an interactive exploration of the program, showcasing the different types of art programming encompassed in the plan. The Open House was attended by over 250 guests interested in the programming.

“A SENSE OF PLACE” PUBLIC ART SYMPOSIUM (November 16 – Seaholm Intake Building)

In partnership with Art in Public Places (AIPP), we will host our first public art symposium, *A Sense of Place*, inviting the community to converse about public art. The event will feature a case study presented by the owners of the Land Art Generator Initiative (LAGI) and a panel discussion with leaders in public art in Austin.

TEMPO (Call for Artists)

In August 2023, the City Council approved a temporary partnership between The Trail Conservancy and Art in Public Places (AIPP), designating TTC as the temporary custodian of the TEMPO public art program. We announced our first Call for Artist’s RFQs on September 1 for the 2024 program. TTC’s Arts + Culture Committee will select artists based on the following criteria:

- Creativity and quality of past work
- Responsiveness to the physical context of the Trail – outdoors, alongside the water
- Demonstrated ability to engage the public and community in which the art is located
- Perspective and relations to the area and neighborhoods around the Trail

Our Technical Advisory Group will also vet selected art and help with site selection. The TAG will be made up of:

- a) A representative of Park Planning, Architecture, or Landscape Divisions
- b) A representative of the Park Operations and Maintenance Division
- c) A representative of the Park Urban Forestry Division
- d) A representative of the Park Special Events Office
- e) A representative of EDD’s Arts in Public Places Division
- f) A representative of the Watershed Protection Department
- g) POMA Partnership Manager (when applicable)
- h) A representative of Public Works and Transportation (when appropriate), and
- i) A member of the Park Rangers and other designated security entities.

CEREMONIES & CELEBRATIONS



BUTLER EXERCISE ENHANCEMENTS RIBBON CUTTING (September 18, 2023 – Butler Shores). Following community engagement in 2020 and planning during 2021-2022, the long-awaited Butler Shores Exercise Equipment Enhancements are complete. We celebrated the project with a Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on September 18 and the Community Grand Opening on September 23. That Saturday will be programmed in partnership with Love, Tito's, and will feature an instructor-led bootcamp style workout demonstrating how to use the new equipment.

RAINEY STREET TRAILHEAD GROUNDBREAKING (TBD, 2023 – Rainey Street Trailhead). Community engagement in 2019 called for adding new amenities around the Rainey Street area. The Rainey Street Trailhead Project will feature new seating areas, a neighborhood lawn, a water access point, and a nature play area. Construction will begin in the Fall of 2023, with the project anticipated to be complete by the end of 2024.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

TTC consistently strives to deepen our relationship with the people we serve. We must allow neighbors to provide insight into our projects, especially those directly affecting them. This practice will enable us to provide more desirable, equitable, and sustainable amenities along the Trail, improving the livability of the communities we directly connect to. We conducted Community Engagement around the following projects this year:



ON-GOING COMMUNITY INPUT. We put community input and engagement at the forefront of our programming and tabling efforts. We set up each week alongside our Music on the Trail and Fitness programming, where we engage and talk with Trail users about how they use the Trail.



COMPREHENSIVE SIGNAGE PLAN. In partnership with PARD, TTC is working with local consultant Page to develop a consistent and uniform signage plan for informational and wayfinding along the Butler Trail. The plan will be developed with specific goals:

- Create consistent signage and wayfinding that improves connections between areas along the Trail, including trailheads, parks, and other community areas
- Enhance the Trail experience, but not take away from the natural beauty
- Highlight the biological systems and educated uses of the functions and values of the Trail
- Increase safety
- Represent the diverse communities with history and multilingual text
- Promote The Trail Conservancy's identity as the steward of the Trail with updated and increased branding
- Present information in a way that can be quickly understood through clear fonts and simple designs

The anticipated project schedule for the Comprehensive Signage community engagement is:

- Phase I: Inventory and Analysis, June – July 2023

- Phase II: Concept through Schematic Design, September – November 2023
- Phase III: Comprehensive Plan Development, January – March 2024

Community Engagement for Phase I:

HERITAGE DAYS. TTC’s Diversity, Equity, and Inclusive Committee selected six core heritage days for us to focus community engagement around. This year, we focused on three of those to build relationships and establish connections for intentional celebrations:

- Pride Month – Since our Music on the Trail series was on hold due to the excessive heat, the TTC team joined the Pride Festival as a sponsor

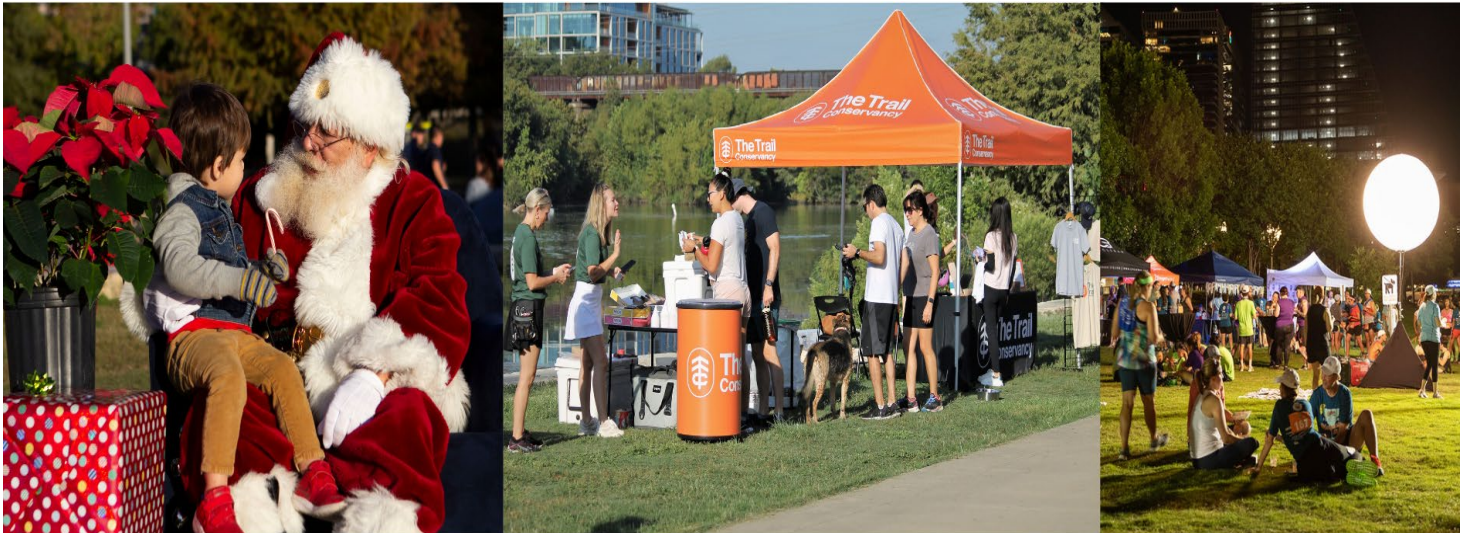

2024 PROGRAMMING PLAN

We will continue our established on-Trail programming and events while intentionally working with community partners to add more educational and ecological programs to the calendar.

COORDINATION AND COMMUNICATION: A calendaring process has been created to include the PARD Community PARKnerships Program Manager as well as the PARD Special Events Office for all programming and special events in order to provide collaboration and avoid conflicts with City or other partner efforts and activations. As stated in the POMA, if either TTC or the City believes the Park is being overused, it will promptly notify the other party. If the other party agrees that the Park is being overused, the parties will work in good faith to develop a mutually agreeable plan to alleviate the overuse.

New programming added for 2024 is denoted in **orange** in the list below:

ARTS + CULTURE PROGRAMMING

- Music on the Trail Series (*Park Open*)
- **TEMPO on the Trail.** In partnership with Arts in Public Places, TTC will add up to eight temporary public art installations around the Butler Trail. We will actively program around the art with ribbon-cutting celebrations, artist talks, art walks, and more. (*Park Open*)

HEALTH + EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMING

- **TrailFit Series.** Expanding our fitness series to encompass a variety of movement and exercise activities for all ages and abilities. The new TrailFit series will include organized walks, boot camps, yoga/movement, barre, and more. (*Park Open*)
- Scavenger Hunt - History of the Trail (*Park Open*)
- Kid's Adopt a Garden (*Park Open*)

ONGOING PROGRAMMATIC ENGAGEMENT

TTC periodically reviews and adapts programming to meet current community priorities and needs. We will continue to include community feedback and engagement in our programming, events, and tabling. We also anticipate conducting at least one survey in 2024 regarding programming on the Trail, asking Trail users how they currently interact with our programming and what other programs or activities they would like.



CAPITAL PROJECT ENGAGEMENT

TTC will submit a comprehensive community engagement plan to the PARD POMA Manager and Community Engagement Consultant for review a minimum of 30 days before engagement implementation. In 2024, we anticipate incorporating engagement into the following capital projects:

- **Holly Area Projects – Trailhead, Trail Enhancements, and Nature Play Area (Kick-Off, Spring 2024)**

This project will deliver various elements proposed in PARD’s Holly Shores/Edward Rendon Sr. Park Vision Plan, revitalizing the open space around the decommissioned Holly Street Power Plan. In September 2023, we began curating a team for the project that will include the project design team and artists from the Holly neighborhood. Both teams will be selected through an RFP process. That combined project team will be responsible for shaping public engagement for the project.

- **Comprehensive Signage Plan Delivered (Spring 2024)**
 - Open House(s) to introduce the plan to the public

- **West Side Boardwalk (TBD, 2024)**

In 2023, TTC worked with TxDOT and the Parks Department on an exciting community benefit that solves a challenging pinch point that currently exists for the Trail, as it was identified in the 2021 Safety & Mobility Study, as well as improve environmental protection of a delicate shoreline between 1st Street and Congress Avenue. The details of the new boardwalk, which TxDOT will fund, are still being worked out. TTC will collaborate with PARD and the Public Works Department in the Fall of 2023 to determine what community engagement is needed.



NEIGHBORHOOD OUTREACH

We will continue to build and nurture relationships with crucial neighborhood groups surrounding the 10-mile hike-and-bike Trail. One way that we plan to do this is through the creation of “Neighborhood Ambassadors.” We will work with super volunteers to assist with educating and amplifying our efforts within their communities. TTC will also support



PARTNER COMMUNICATION

The Butler Trail is a crucial transportation option for many locals and visitors attending events around the Trail. And, with two major transportation projects on the horizon and several large-scale construction projects planned around the Trail, we anticipate use of the Trail will continue to increase. TTC will continue to coordinate with and support our partners and Trail neighbors to amplify messaging that will impact the Trail – either as a temporary detour or last-mile option. Some of that messaging will include:

- TxDOT Detours for I-35 expansion
- Toomey Detour
- Waterloo Greenway Confluence re-routes
- Festival & Event Traffic Mitigation (ACL Festival, Kite Fest, Food & Wine Festival, and more)
- PARD’s “Leave No Trace” messaging



HERITAGE DAYS

We will continue to honor the under-represented communities and those who were here before we were with our programming and outreach. We will continue working to integrate all six core Heritage Days meaningfully into our communication, outreach, and programming. The core heritage days our DEI Committee identified as our first area of focus include:

APPENDIX: City of Austin SD23 & 2019 PARD Long Range Plan Alignment

Austin's growing population and popularity of special events in city parks are increasing demands on Austin's public park system. The programming efforts outlined in this plan align with the vision and values outlined in the City of Austin SD23 document, as well as the 2019 PARD Long Range Plan, with particular emphasis on programming that highlights and fosters equality, health, and the environment, safety, mobility/connectivity, sustainability, and education.

Through this Programming Plan and our partnership with the City of Austin, TTC seeks to:

- Find a healthy balance between events and public access
- Ensure that neighborhoods have equitable opportunities for cultural and neighborhood-oriented events
- Bring neighborhoods and communities to the table, allowing them a formal role in decisions about plans for nearby parkland
- Bring new audiences to the Trail, particularly those from traditionally underrepresented communities.

City of Austin SD23 Strategic Outcomes that align with TTC's programming and operations:



Mobility: TTC efforts contribute to optimizing community safety on the Trail, including Trail etiquette, emergency response, flood risk, and disaster resiliency. By promoting programming and new ways to use the Trail and parkland, TTC is introducing more Austin residents to this forever-free resource that can provide a mode of transportation. TTC also highlights CapMetro routes for all events on the Trail (and on the TTC website) and encourages Austinites to use the Trail as a mode of transportation to get to events in the parkland, such as ACL Music Festival and Trail of Lights.



Health & Environment: TTC programming and engagement seeks to provide greater accessibility to the high-quality parkland along the Trail, helping to further Austin's ParkScore "score" and ranking among US cities. Cumulative TTC efforts are also aimed at environmental quality, climate change and resilience, and healthy conditions for Austin residents.



Safety: Through careful deployment of identified projects in the 2020 Butler Trail Safety & Mobility Plan, as well as activating parkland on a more consistent basis, TTC's work furthers the City of Austin's efforts towards creating a safe environment in this critical downtown area. Through TTC community engagement efforts, the organization is seeking to build meaningful community relationships that fosters trust and legitimacy and increases compliance with park regulations.

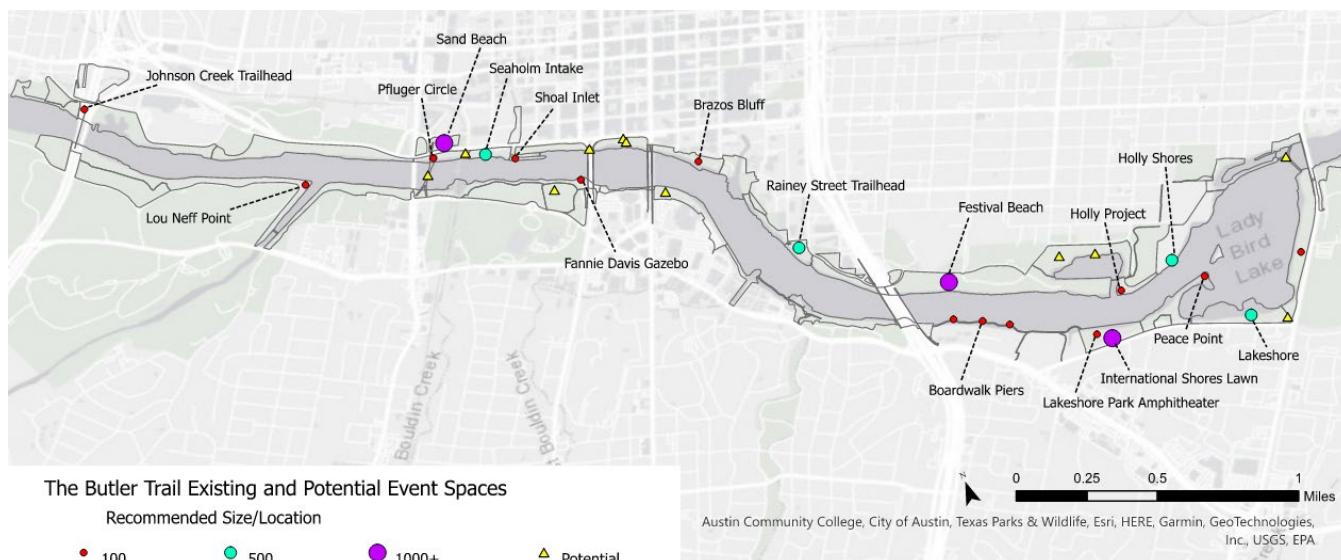
