

Texas State Library & Archives Commission

\$69.7 million budget request; plus, five exceptional items

TLA priority given to exceptional item #4

• \$4.4 million to provide local IT support and broadband readiness to small, rural libraries

HB 540 by Longoria, relating to the award of library construction grants by the Texas State Library & Archives Commission; companion SB 197 by Eckhardt



Bills Related to Content

• **HB 552** by Troxclair, relating to repealing the affirmative defense to prosecution for the criminal offense of sale, distribution, or display of harmful material to a minor

• **HB 571** by Leo-Wilson, relating to repealing the affirmative defense to prosecution for the criminal offense of sale, distribution, or display of harmful material to a minor



Bills Related to Content

- **HB 338** by Oliverson, relating to content ratings for books and other written materials used in public schools
- **HB 231** by Swanson, relating to the purchase of online library resources for primary and secondary schools by the Texas State Library and Archives Commission



Bills Related to Parental Rights

• **SB 165** by Campbell, relating to parental rights in public education and to audits of school district curricula by the Texas Education Agency

• **HB 631** by Toth, relating to parental rights in education
