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### What is The Living Streets Program?

Envisions residential streets as places where communities can walk, bike, gather, and connect

- Pandemic-era *Healthy Streets Initiative* expired
- Living Streets Program created through Council <u>Resolution No.</u> <u>20211021-02</u> in October 2021. It includes three resident requested activations






### Precursor to Living Streets Pandemic-era Healthy Streets Initiative

#### Started May 2020

- 16 installations throughout the city
- September 2020 resident survey showed high levels of support for the initiative
- Lessons Learned:
  - Residents wanted notice and inclusion in the process
  - The street type matters





Why are you using Healthy Streets?

### Resolution No. 20211021-02 Key Notes & Goals

- Residents were supportive of Pandemic
  Program
- Council directs the City Manager to create the "Street Programs" - Living Streets
- Residential streets can help build community, increase safety, and improve quality of life
- Community building to aid with disaster relief
- Supports Austin Strategic Mobility Plan
- Use "soft" closures to create connectivity and community
- Address equity issues by making Living Streets accessible

### Resolution No. 20211021-02 Requirements

- Make the program "as straightforward, easy, accessible, affordable, inclusive, and equitable as possible".
- Living Streets will be a resident-led process.
- 60% of the residents of a proposed street must approve with a signature to support an activation.
- 3-6 months with an option for renewal (except NBP).
- Develop low-cost options for street access points.
- Simplify the process.



# Neighborhood Block Parties

- Applied for and managed by a resident who resides on the street
- City has a first come, first served barricade loan program with signage, lights and safety vests.
- 1 block in length.
- A one-time closure, up to 24 hours in length that abides by noise regulations.

#### **Apply for a Neighborhood Block Party**







### **Healthy Streets**

- Applied for by a resident who resides on the street
- The city installs and manages cones, barrels, barricades and signage to create street access points
- ~3-4 blocks in length
- Around the clock "soft" closures that are meant to deter through traffic
- 3-6 months, with the opportunity to renew

#### **Apply for a Healthy Street or Play Street**





## **Play Streets**

- Applied for and managed by a resident
- Resident will set up and take down Play Street barricades and signage provided by the City
- 1 block in length
- Uses "soft" closures with city provided barricades
- Up to 3 days a week for up to 12 hours a week
- 3-6 months in duration, with the opportunity to renew

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#### Healthy and Play Streets Viability Street Analysis



Eligible streets:


- Be a residential street (ASMP Class 1 road or lower)
- Be approximately 25-40 feet wide (typically a 2lane road with parking and partial or no sidewalk)
- Have 90% or more residential parcels. Streets with multifamily buildings will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

Ineligible streets :

- Connect directly to a major arterial road
- Affect a traffic signal
- Affect a transit route

## Expression of Interest, Applications, and Installations



**1.Express your interest** – The resident fills out an Expression of Interest online.


**2.Coordinate with City staff** – Program staff will communicate with the resident to choose the best nearby street for an activation.

**3.Complete the application** – The resident will collect signatures, find a sponsor if needed, and complete the application.

**4.Staff review** – City staff will review all applications submitted and choose the applications that best fit program intentions and resources.

**5.Project installation** – City staff will install or deliver the equipment for the activation





Play Streets Applications

### **Communications and Outreach**

Goal: Living Streets will be accessible, affordable, inclusive, and equitable.

Community outreach will focus on Equity Analysis Zones.

- "Medium-High Vulnerable" (light blue)
- "Most Vulnerable" Equity Analysis Zones (dark blue)

#### Methods:

- Tabling and pop-up events
- Tri-fold pamphlet and flyers
- Sign campaigns:

- Social Media Campaign
