PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1947 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story Minimal Traditional house with horizontal siding, 1:1 screened wood windows, a gabled porch, and side-gabled roof.

RESEARCH

The house at 1804 East 22nd Street was built in 1947 for James Franklin and Nettie Wright. James Wright, who worked as a floor finisher, made several additions and alterations to the home shortly after its completion, including the construction of an attached garage, rear addition, and covered porch. The Wrights lived in the home until around 1958, when they sold it to Wesley and Ruth C. Ellison. The Ellisons raised their two sons there, remaining in the home at least until Wesley's death in 1970.

PROPERTY EVALUATION


The 2016 East Austin historic resource survey lists the property as contributing to potential local and National Register historic districts.


Designation Criteria—Historic Landmark

- 1) The building is more than 50 years old.
- 2) The building appears to retain high integrity.
- 3) Properties must meet two criteria for landmark designation (LDC §25-2-352). Staff has evaluated the property and determined that it does not meet two criteria:
 - a. Architecture. The building does not appear to convey architectural significance.
 - b. Historical association. The property does not appear to have significant historical associations.
 - c. Archaeology. The property was not evaluated for its potential to yield significant data concerning the human history or prehistory of the region.
 - d. Community value. The property does not appear to possess a unique location, physical characteristic, or significant feature that contributes to the character, image, or cultural identity of the city, the neighborhood, or a particular demographic group.
 - e. Landscape feature. The property is not a significant natural or designed landscape with artistic, aesthetic, cultural, or historical value to the city.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive reuse, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package.
