# November 2023 AUSTIN ANIMAL SERVICES REPORT

## **Animal Services News**

- The live outcome rate for November was 96.8 percent.
- The Austin Animal Center took in 763 animals including, 352 cats and 376 dogs.
- The Austin Animal Center adopted 571 cats and dogs (259 cats and 312 dogs).
- 69 animals (59 dogs and 10 cats) were returned to their owners from the Austin Animal Center.
- On November 1, 2023, there were 1,053 cats and dogs within the ASO inventory (679 at AAC and 374 in foster).
- On December 1, 2023, there were 984 cats and dogs within the ASO inventory (694 at AAC, 288 in foster, 1 at APA and 1 at a vet)

## **Animal Protection**

- Completed 19 RTO's
- Gave out 28 fencing referrals.
- Implanted 0 microchips.
- Impounded 104 injured animals.
- Delivered approximately 41 wildlife animals to Austin Wildlife Rescue
- Entered 184 exposure reports.
- Sent 18 specimens to the state lab for rabies testing. We had 3 rabies positive bats and 1 positive skunk.

# Volunteer, Foster, and Rescue Programs

- 132 animals were adopted directly from foster care.
- More than 244 different people/families fostered.
- 158 new foster applications were processed.
- There are currently 1324 members (approved fosters) in the foster program's GivePulse group.
- 2 pets died or were euthanized in foster care in November (based on the reports that are available to us).
- As of December 2nd, @ 2 p.m. there are 301 animals in foster care438 volunteers contributed 5,344 hours in October.
- 476 volunteers contributed 5,746 hours in November.
- 50 individuals donated 10 hours toward group volunteer service, through dog-walking and general cat care.
- The Volunteer Program held 3 orientations, introducing 85 potential volunteers to shelter operations.
- The Volunteer Program scheduled 9 Community Service Restitution individuals to perform 82 hours of laundry, dishes and other duties as assigned.
- 98 volunteers attended their first animal handling training or mentor shift in November.
- 185 animals were transferred to approved rescue organizations (100 dogs and 85 cats).

#### **Vet Services**

- Emergencies cases treated at AAC 71
- Emergencies transferred from EC 44
- Spay/Neuter surgeries performed 426



- 717 vaccinations were given with only one provided to a dog under four weeks.

## **Pet Resource Center**

- Provided Resources to 111 customers.
- Assisted 15 walk-up customers for free microchip services at the PRC.
- Assisted 60 Spanish speaking customers.
- Assisted 556 customers total (includes all customers who checked into the PRC waitlist)
- Average wait time for customers was under 12 minutes.
