3	WHEREAS, City Council Resolution 20170831-060 directed the City Manager
4	to allocate 15% of the seven-cent portion of the City's Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) to
5	support operations and maintenance of City of Austin historic facilities and sites in
6	accordance with Texas Tax Code Section 351.101(a)(5); and
7	WHEREAS, City Council Resolution 20181004-033 directed the City Manager
8	to allocate the Historic Preservation Fund Fiscal Year 2019 budget in the following
9	manner:
10	• 70 percent for City of Austin historic facilities and sites in accordance with
11	Texas Tax Code Section 351.101(a)(5);
12	• 15 percent reserved for potential future historic acquisitions or major
13	preservation projects that would be frequented by tourists and convention
14	delegates; and
15	• 15 percent for the Heritage Grant Program; and
16	The resolution also directed the City Manager to:
17	• expand the eligible applicants for heritage grants per the recommendations
18	of the Visitor Impact Task Force and the Heritage Grant Working Group;
19	• expand eligible projects for Heritage Grants to include capital projects and
20	planning, educational, and marketing projects; and

21	• Increase the \$59,000 cap on individual Heritage Grant awards to \$250,000
22	with staff discretion to recommend to Council grant requests above this
23	threshold; and
24	WHEREAS, City staff use City Council Resolution No. 20181004-033 as a
25	guide for how to apportion funds in future fiscal years; and
26	WHEREAS, Texas Tax Code Section 351.101(a)(5) authorizes hotel occupancy
27	tax revenue to be used for historic restoration and preservation projects or activities or
28	advertising and conducting solicitations and promotional programs to encourage
29	tourists and convention delegates to visit preserved historic sites or museums:
30	• at or in the immediate vicinity of the convention center facilities or visitor
31	information centers; or
32	• located elsewhere in the municipality or its vicinity that would be
33	frequented by tourists and convention delegates; and
34	WHEREAS, through Council's approval of the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 City of
35	Austin Budget (Ordinance xxxx) and the ordinance related to this resolution approved
36	in the same Council meeting as this resolution amending the Fiscal Year 2023-2024
37	City of Austin Budget to increase appropriations to the Economic Development
38	Department Operating Budget Special Revenue Historic Preservation Fund, funding in
39	the amount of \$31,723,887 is available in fiscal Year 2023-2024 to the Economic

40	Development Department for eligible historic restoration and preservation projects and
41	activities; and
42	WHEREAS, for nearly two decades, a portion of the Austin Convention and
43	Visitors Bureau (now Visit Austin) budget has been allocated to fund and administer
44	the Heritage Grant Program, and Visit Austin ceased administration of the program at
45	the end of 2018; and
46	NOW, THEREFORE,
47	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:
48	The City Manager is authorized to award, negotiate, and execute historic
49	preservation fund service contracts for Fiscal Year 2023-2024, in a total amount not to
50	exceed \$31,723,887 for historic preservation and restoration projects, as recommended
51	by staff.
