- Community Resiliency Improvement Status Portal (CRISP)
 created in 2022 captures After Action Report
 recommendations from major disasters dating back to 2013
 - CRISP serves as single location to access After Action Reports and to view progress on recommendations
 - Recommendations from 2013 to the present uploaded and assigned to departments for status updates
- All action items undergoing status review
- Dashboard platform under review

Recommendation 6: City Staffing in Response to Emergencies

- Departments have identified staff to respond to emergencies
- Disaster Reservist Program
- Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Training
 - Internal HSEM drills
 - Monthly meetings for departmental EOC representatives
 - Large scale exercises and departmental exercises
- Food and lodging during disasters
 - City procedure in place through Procurement for lodging
 - Food available for EOC staff



Recommendation 7: Supplies and Equipment

- Logistics branch formed. Five out of six positions filled
- Maximo utilized to track inventory
- Mission Ready Packages deployed throughout City
- Stocked inventory follows FEMA guidelines
- Certificates of Exemption procurement process allows purchase of supplies outside of normal procurement practices during emergencies



Recommendation 8: Language Accessibility

Emergency warning messages pre-translated in 14 languages

 Formed relationships with community groups to disseminate information

 Launched Phase II Ready Central Texas Campaign

 Currently focusing on Winter Weather and Severe Weather Preparedness

- Phase II Ready Central Texas Campaign Metrics
 - Over 2 million residents reached with Phase II of Ready Central Texas Campaign



Recommendation 9: Equitable Access to Disaster Response Efforts

- Equity Office incorporated into Emergency Operations Center
- Departmental outreach to vulnerable populations
- State of Texas Emergency Assistance Registry (STEAR) targets people with access and functional needs such as:
 - Limited mobility
 - Communication barriers
 - Additional medical assistance during an emergency event
 - Transportation assistance
 - Personal care assistance



Recommendation 10: Improve City and Community Cooperation

- Developed a Neighborhood Preparedness Guide and Community Preparedness Training program for involving the community in disaster preparedness and planning
- Invited County, regional, and nonprofits partners to large scale exercises
- Invited private healthcare sector partners to large scale exercises



Mara Corrective Action Plan Update

- Engaged Tetratech
- Projected completion in March
- Departments taking corrective action from Winter Storm Mara's After Action Report recommendations
- Corrective Action Plan will consolidate items from within Winter Storm Mara's After Action Report and will also consider prior disaster reports
