Posting Language

Authorize negotiation and execution of Amendment No. 7 to an agreement with Ending Community Homelessness Coalition, Inc. to connect individuals experiencing homelessness in Austin and Travis County to opportunities for safe, stable, and permanent housing, to add a six-month term beginning April 1, 2024, in an amount not to exceed \$65,000, for a revised total agreement amount not to exceed \$910,000.

Funding in the amount of \$65,000 is included in the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Austin Public Health Department Operating Budget.

Prior Council Action:

September 1, 2022 - Council authorized negotiation and execution of Amendment No. 5 to an agreement with Ending Community Homelessness Coalition, Inc., on an 11-0 vote.

December 14, 2017 - Council approved a 10-month agreement with Ending Community Homelessness Coalition, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$130,000, with four 12-month extension options each in an amount not to exceed \$130,000, for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$650,000, on a 10-0 vote, with Council Member Pool off the dais.

Approval of negotiation and execution of Amendment No. 7 to an agreement with Ending Community Homelessness Coalition, Inc. will help connect individuals experiencing homelessness in Austin/Travis County to opportunities for permanent housing through the provision of navigation, outreach, and service coordination.

Amendment No. 1 exercised the first extension option for the 12-month period beginning on October 1, 2018.
