## **Climate Change Is A Public Health Issue**

- Poor **air quality** from ground-level ozone and wildfire smoke are linked to higher rates of **asthma and lung cancer**
- Extreme heat can be deadly for seniors, outdoor workers, unhoused people and people suffering from mental illnesses
- Severe storms can cause power outages and **disrupt critical infrastructure**
- Low-income and **communities of color are the most impacted** by the worst effects of climate change













## **Time commitment**

- JSC meets monthly on the fourth Wednesday at 6pm (City Hall; hybrid format)
- Members may serve on working groups related to the Austin Climate Equity Plan sections, 1-2 meetings per month
  - Sustainable Buildings
