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
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Fatalities and Serious Injuries declined in 2023 compared with 2022




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
All modes except for "pedalcyclist" saw fewer fatal crashes in 2023 than 2022

Fatal crashes on City streets continued a flat/downward trend






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


People experiencing homelessness continue to make up a disproportionate share of pedestrian and bicyclist fatalities





Major Intersection safety projects

- Completed intersection safety projects are improving safety:
 - 31% decrease in serious injury / fatal crashes
 - 30% decrease in all crashes
- 2016 Bond Vision Zero projects anticipated to be substantially complete by end of 2024
- 7 major intersection projects completed in 2023
- 1 completed thus far in 2024 (S. Lamar Blvd. / West Gate Blvd.)
- 11 more expected to start construction in 2024
- 14 more in various stages of scoping or design





Systemic Safety strategies

Low-cost, high-impact safety treatments

- Systemic Safety: low-cost countermeasures to proactively address safety risks across the network
 - e.g. pedestrian crossings; street lighting; curve warnings; traffic signal phasing
- Highlight: signalized intersection left turn protection
 - Implemented changes at 70+ intersections
 - Early results:
 - Over 70% reduction in Opposite Direction
 Left Turn crashes
 - Nearly 50% reduction in injury + fatal crashes overall

Vision Zero Program Updates

Safe Streets and Roads for All grant

- 2022 SS4A award (\$23 million)
 - Engineering and design underway for major intersection projects and pedestrian hybrid beacons
 - First projects expected to start construction in fall 2024
 - Citywide Lighting Plan anticipated to kick off summer/fall 2024
- Received partial 2023 SS4A award (\$288K)
 - ADA Transition Plan for Crossings and Traffic Signals
- 2024 SS4A funding opportunity this spring

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Upcoming initiatives

- April Distracted Driving Awareness campaign
 - Radio and social media campaign
 - In-person events in Montopolis and Del Valle
- Public engagement for key TPW safety projects
 - Rutland Dr. corridor spring/summer 2024
 - Cameron / Dessau corridor spring/summer 2024
 - 12-month Barton Springs Rd. Safety Pilot update in August
- 11 major intersection safety projects anticipated to start construction in 2024
 - US 183 / Burleson Rd. (in construction)
 - Stassney Ln. /S. Congress Ave. (in construction)
 - E. 7th / Springdale Rd.
 - Stassney Ln. / S. 1st St.
 - Cameron Rd. / US 183 SVRD
 - Regency Dr. / FM 969
 - 7th St. / Comal St.
 - Bluff Springs Rd. / Quicksilver Blvd.
