


About the Medically Vulnerable Registry

 Supports eligible customers with critical illnesses or life saving medical equipment

• Over 250 residents served each year







Many Austin Energy customers are not able to access the City's Medically Vulnerable Registry due to a complex application process.



Residents on master meters not able to participate




Recertification frequency



Challenges obtaining physician signature Challenges with the recertification process:

- 45% of survey respondents noted issues with frequency of recertification and obtaining a physician signature
- Austin's program requires more frequent recertifications than other cities

About 70% of applications were denied due to applicants not submitting documents on time.

- Denied Other reasons
- Approved



The City uses a manual process to manage application and eligibility verification, increasing the risk that the data may not be secure and reliable, and leading to inefficiencies.





We reviewed eligibility verification documents for a sample of 100 applicants.


8 applications with no physician signature

24 applications with no MVR category

43 applications with no patient or account holder signature

Additional Observation

The City of Austin's Medically Vulnerable Registry program appears to offer more services than similar programs from cities we reviewed.



The General Manger of Austin Energy should:

Continue working with stakeholders to evaluate the frequency of recertification requirements and the possibility of a wider range of entities who can certify serious illness.

Incorporate an online option to receive application documents and reorganize the existing application forms to ensure that the sections to be filled by the applicant and the physician are well-aligned.
