



About Hungry Hill Foundation

We are a 2½ year old nonprofit from East Austin. We opened a resource center at 1189 Springdale in June 2022. Our annual budget is \$750,000.

We are a rare Black-lead non-profit, staffed completely by people with lived-in experience. Chase Wright, our executive director, has been in East Austin his entire life and was profoundly impacted by the economic and law-enforcement policies that impoverish East Austin.

Despite accolades, our results were achieved with minimal support from the City of Austin and the philanthropic community because of the classic chicken/egg problem -- they can't fund you without a track record of spending money well and you can't build that track record without spending money.

Workforce Development

- Hungry Hill Foundation's core mission is **supportive employment**.
- We run a sophisticated multi-tier program that addresses the unique barriers for people who are unhoused or exiting incarceration at every step on their journey.
- Our system leverages group dynamics to enable people to overcome the individual challenges that prevent them from being employable.
- Target Outcomes:
 - Employment in jobs paying a living wage funded by private employers.
 - Sufficient income to pay less than 30% of wages on rent.
 - Resolution/Continued Treatment of root causes of homelessness.
