# February 2024 AUSTIN ANIMAL SERVICES REPORT

## **Animal Services News**

- The live outcome rate for February was 97.35%.
- A total of **914** animals were brought to the shelter which included 344 cats, 496 dogs, 57 wild animals, 8 guinea pigs, 6 rabbits, a chinchilla, a chicken, and a duck.
- A total of **365 animals were adopted** (222 dogs, 136 cats, 5 rabbits, a guinea pig and a duck).
- A total of 84 dogs and cats were returned to their owners (RTOs and RTO-Adopt).
- On **February 1**, there were **711 dogs and cats** within the ASO inventory (399 onsite, 311 in foster, and 1 at a vet clinic).
- On March 3, there were 694 dogs and cats within the ASO inventory (423 onsite, 269 in foster, 1 at APA, and 1 at a vet clinic).

# **Animal Protection**

- Animal Protection Officers (APOs) returned 25 animals to their owners in the field.
- Officers handed out **35 fencing assistance applications** and implanted **1** microchip(s).
- Officers impounded 94 injured animals and delivered 41 wildlife animals to Austin Wildlife Rescue.
- Officers entered 259 rabies exposure reports and submitted 61 specimens for rabies testing. All specimens
  returned negative and were viable/good condition for testing.
- 68 total coyote related activities
  - o 24 Wild Sick
  - o **4** Wild Speak
  - o **0** Wild Injured
  - 34 Sightings
  - 2 Encounters
  - o 2 Incidents
  - Observations
- Out of 68 coyote related reports, 40 reports fell within the reported behavior types. Behavior types include Sighting, Encounter, Incident, and Observation. "Observation" is defined as hearing coyotes howling and finding scat or footprints.
  - o Encounters: Pets were a factor in 5/5 (100%) of encounters reported.
    - 1/2 encounters (50%) involved a coyote "coming up close to caller."
    - 1/2 encounters (50%) involved a coyote following caller and pet.
  - o Incidents: Pets were a factor in 1/1 (100%) of incidents reported.
    - 1/2 incidents (50%) involved a coyote injuring an unattended small pet. Neighbor saw aftermath.
    - 1/2 incidents (50%) involved a coyote killing an unattended small dog in fenced backvard.
- There was 119% increase in reports from February 2023 to February 2024.
- There was an 21% decrease from January 2024 (79) to February 2024.



### Volunteer

- A total of 487 volunteers donated 5,192 hours of volunteer service.
- 57 individuals donated 114 hours toward group volunteer service, through dog-walking and general cat care.
- The Volunteer Program held 4 orientations, introducing 109 potential volunteers to shelter operations.
- The Volunteer Program scheduled **12 Community Service Restitution individuals to perform 98 hours** of laundry, dishes and other duties as assigned.
- 123 volunteers dedicated their time to volunteer development and training.

# Foster & Rescue

- 130 animals were adopted directly from foster care.
- More than 230 different people/families fostered.
- **164 new foster applications were processed**. (This number does not necessarily include walk-in / in person applications that were processed.)
- There are currently **749 members (approved fosters) in the foster program's GivePulse group**. (We did a membership clean up in January. Everyone that is currently in the group indicated that they wished to remain active and plan to foster a pet within the next 12 months.)
- 1 pet(s) died or were euthanized in foster care in February (based on the reports that are available to us).
- As of March 5, 2024 @ 9:30 a.m. there are **281 animals in foster care**.

### **Vet Services**

- AAC vets performed 732 exams.
- AAC vets spayed/neutered 427 animals.
- 0 visibly pregnant animals were spayed.
- 63 emergency cases were treated at AAC.
- 49 emergencies were transferred from the emergency clinic.
- The estimated emergency clinic bill for **February is \$28,863.36**.
- 7 animals received orthopedic surgeries.
- **17 animals** received other specialty surgeries (enucleations, amputations, mass removals, hernia repair, wound repairs, dentals, etc).
- 2 cruelty cases were treated.
- **54 animals were pulled** by Austin Pets Alive! for medical reasons (15 medical urgent, 10 medical attention, 13 neonatal, 3 pregnant, 3 parvo/panleuk).
- APA pulled 5 large dogs and 5 small dogs for behavior in February.

### **Staffing**

- There are currently 3 full-time employee positions posted.
- 8 full-time employees are currently in the hiring process.
