As someone deeply committed to public health and social justice, my interest in becoming a member of the HIV Planning Council is to contribute meaningfully in my community in the fight against HIV/AIDS, and to improve the lives of those who are HIV positive. As a public health major at UT, an EMT, and a frequent community volunteer, I have personally seen the importance of addressing the health disparities in our community and ensuring equitable access to medical care for all people. Furthermore, since HIV is a preventable and treatable disease, with the proper public health interventions it is possible to greatly decrease the incidence of HIV and prolong the life of those living with HIV. Due to this, I believe that being a member of the HIV Planning Council will allow me to be a play a part in helping to come up with actionable health interventions and that the proper medical resources and education are accessible and digestible to everybody in Austin to ensure that people know when to utilize the proper medical resources (PrEP, PEP, testing services) and how to access them to allow for the prevention of disease and timely diagnosis. I also believe that it is imperative to educate all members of our community about HIV since HIV can affect anyone and to reduce stigma of the disease which will improve the wellbeing of HIV positive individuals living in our community.
