

Especially Relevant Recommendations

- Recognize and honor Austin's full history by listening to community members and sharing stories out through interpretation. (Recommendations 1, 2, 5, 6)
- Use creative interpretation to tell the full stories of historic places in Austin. (5)
- Support people staying in place through accessory dwelling units (ADUs), resources for heirs' property owners and low-income seniors, and a legacy inheritance incentive. (18, 21, 22)
- Improve historic designation and historic review processes to be more clear, streamlined, and transparent. (34)




