Authorize negotiation and execution of a contract for critical incident stress management services with Dr. Tania Glenn & Assocs. PA, for up to five years for a total contract amount not to exceed \$450,000.

This contract will provide critical incident stress management services for Austin-Travis County Emergency Medical Services frontline first responders. The contractor is specialized in treating mental health issues related to the stress and trauma experienced by first responders who provide emergency medical services for the Austin and Travis County population of over 2.2 million.

For over 25 years, Dr. Tania Glenn and her counseling staff have provided critical incident stress management services for Austin-Travis County Emergency Medical Services. They have established themselves as a reliable and cost-effective resource and have earned the trust and confidence of employees.

This contract will replace an existing contract which expires June 25, 2024. The requested authorization amount was determined using departmental estimates based on historical spending and anticipated future usage. The recommended contractor is the current provider of these services. This contract supports the City's

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Strategic Outcomes of Safety and Health & Environment by providing critical mental health assistance to first responders, which results in improving the performance provided to the public.

A delay in contract approval could have a significant effect on the mental health of our Austin-Travis County Emergency Medical Services first responders seeking treatment for mental health issues related to stress and trauma experienced on the job.
