Our Future 35 can provide transformational new infrastructure for Austin that is of regional and national significance


- TxDOT project lowering the main lanes allows the City to deck over the highway

- Local enhancement can provide an array of community benefits and change the landscape of Austin





### POTENTIAL BENEFITS OF FREEWAY CAPS


- Reconnect East and West Austin

# **OUR FUTURE 35** Cap and Stitch Definitions




#### **TX DOT BASELINE STITCH –**

Enhanced freeway overcrossing providing 30 feet of bike/ped and landscaping behind the curb **COA STITCH** – Freeway deck less than 300 feet long (no tunnel ventilation required) **CAP** – Freeway deck greater than 300 feet long (effectively creates a "tunnel" and requires fire/life safety)

### WHERE ARE CAPS POSSIBLE?

Height Clearances

The image below shows a cross section through a highway cap. The cap needs to have at least 16 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> feet height clearance above the roadway and any ramps or structures.




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### WHAT IS POSSIBLE ON TOP OF CAPS?


Maximum Building Heights

- Buildings may be 1-2 stories max.
- Buildings 3 stories or higher would require additional engineering and cost (unlikely to be feasible).



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### **DRAFT VISION AND GOALS**

#### **VISION STATEMENT:**

New shared public spaces over I-35 are inclusive and sustainable; support economic opportunity and equity; celebrate heritage and cultural narratives; support community health and restorative natural spaces; encourage environmental stewardship; and promote safe and comfortable access to all citizens.



#### **Equity & Inclusivity**

Engage community members who have been impacted by and excluded from past infrastructure decisions, and ensure that new amenities are dynamic, sustainable, and welcome communities of all races and identities.

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#### **Health & Human Nature**

Create spaces that enhance the quality of life and wellbeing of users, encourage active transportation, employ native and adapted resilient and restorative landscapes, and promote connection to nature.



#### Economic Affordability & Vitality

Foster design elements and activations for small and local businesses, and mitigate displacement and adverse cost of living impacts of the project on surrounding neighborhoods and communities of color.



#### Community & Cultural Narratives

Celebrate the historical and cultural fabric of past and present communities surrounding I-35 while recognizing the city and highway's histories of fracture, and collect and amplify the narratives and histories of community members.



#### **Environmental Sustainability**

Advance the Austin community's commitment to environmental stewardship, recognize broader climate action imperatives, and build the capacity to successfully maintain and adapt these spaces.



#### Safety & Accessibility

Connect community members to jobs, services, and each other and promote safe and comfortable hubs that provide access to, from, and across I-35, and foster modes of travel that welcome and support all ages and abilities.



Which amenities are most important to provide at each cap (trees, shade, bike/ped paths assumed at all caps):

- Play areas
- Recreational lawn space
- Public art
- Water features / splashpads
- Pollinator gardens
- Cooling stations (ex., misters)
- Small business incubator space
- Micromobility stations (ex., E-bikes, scooters)
- Artist workspace
- Food vending / Food hall

- Outdoor gym/exercise stations
- Renewable energy generation
- Sports courts
- Event space for festivals / community events
- Dog parks
- Arts and culture performance space
- Other (open ended)
