

Why This Matters for Sustainability

- It can take 10-80 years for a new energy-efficient building to recoup the embodied energy lost when an older building is demolished.
- Rehabilitating older buildings reduces landfill waste.
- Reducing demolitions helps avoid negative public health impacts, preserve market-affordable housing, and create jobs.

Plan Vision

Historic preservation in Austin actively engages communities in protecting and sharing important places and stories. Preservation uses the past to create a shared sense of belonging and to shape an equitable, inclusive, sustainable, and economically vital future for all.





Draft Plan Goals

- 1. Tell Austin's full history
- 2. Recognize cultural heritage
- 3. Preserve archaeological resources
- 4. Stabilize communities
- 5. Support environmental sustainability
- 6. Engage communities equitably
- 7. Support people doing the work
- 8. Engage new partners

- 9. Proactively identify important places
- 10. Follow good designation practices
- 11. Support stewardship of community assets
- 12. Be strategic with review
- 13. Protect historic resources
- 14. Implement the plan collaboratively





What We Preserve

Think broadly.

- Recognize Austin's rich and complex history through active listening, inclusive research, and interpretation
- Better recognize and protect legacy businesses, murals, and archaeological resources
- Use preservation tools to support community stabilization and environmental sustainability





Who Preserves

Invite and support.

- Help people access knowledge, resources, and decision-making power
- Streamline and explain historic review and designation processes
- Support craftspeople, commissioners, and staff
- Engage new partners and audiences











How We Preserve

Be strategic and effective.

- Update designation criteria to reflect modern standards
- Support the stewards of Austin's historic properties
- Be strategic with review
- Improve enforcement processes
- Implement the plan collaboratively







Especially Relevant Recommendations

- Recognize the significant external costs associated with demolition by adopting policies and practices that incentivize alternatives. (28)
- Make it easier to relocate buildings within Austin. (29)
- Encourage property owners to retain older buildings by allowing approved demolition permits to be converted to relocation permits. (30)
- Encourage deconstruction and materials salvage when preservation in place and relocation are not feasible. (31)
- Streamline and expedite the development review process for projects that support the retention of historic-age properties. (19)
- Explore a tiered rehabilitation tax abatement for non-designated historic-age properties.
 (26)
- Ensure all property owners have information about rehabilitation and preservation options, particularly for historic and historic-age buildings. (76)







