WaterWise Landscape Rebates

- Helps residents convert healthy turf grass to native/adapted plant beds.
- Native/adapted plant beds use half as much water as traditional turf grass in the summer months.
- The current rebate offers \$100 per 100 square feet converted (min. 500 square feet – max. 3,000 square feet).
- The City of Austin does not incentivize the conversion to gravel or artificial turf lawns.

Raise awareness about the WaterWise Landscape rebate program by:

- Providing educational materials that demonstrate the benefits of the WaterWise program.
- Creating a dedicated space on the City's website with resources, guides, and tools.
- Using multilingual and accessible multimedia advertisements.
- Providing additional communication methods beyond traditional advertising mediums.





Landscape Survival Tools Combine mulch, compost, and core aeration for a \$120 saving.




WaterWise Rainscape Use landscape features to retain rainwater. Receive a rebate of \$0.50 per square foot converted (100 sq. ft. minimum), up to \$1500 per property.



Rainwater Harvesting Up to \$5,000 per site, based on rainwater storage capacity.





Landscape Conservation Rebates

WaterWise Landscape Rebate

- Combine mulch, compost, and core aeration for a \$120 Savings, keeping water on your yard.
- Replace turf with native plants for up to \$3,000 in rebates.

Irrigation Upgrade Rebate

Get up to \$1,000 in rebates for improving your irrigation system's water efficiency.

WaterWise Rainscape Rebate

Residential customers and schools can install landscape features like berms, terraces, swales, rain gardens, and porous pavement to retain rainwater efficiently. Save \$0.50 per square foot converted (100 sq. ft. minimum), with rebates up to \$1500 per property.

Rainwater Harvesting Rebate

Receive **50 cents per gallon** for non-pressurized systems and **\$1 per gallon** for pressurized systems, or 50% of equipment costs, whichever is lower. **Maximum rebate is \$5,000.**

Save money, water through Austin Water's WaterWise Landscape Rebate program



Residents in Austin can help conserve water, save money and have a beautiful lawn by participating in Austin Water's WiseWise landscape rebate program.

"What we're trying to do is incentivize the removal of turf grass, which uses a lot of water, and [encourage residents to] replace it with native plant beds," Conservation Program Coordinator Christopher Charles said.

Residents who participate in the program receive a rebate for replacing their turf grass with native plants, such as Texas sage, lantana, salvia, mountain laurel and agave plants.

How it works

Sponsored by: Austin Water

Residents will fill out an application online and send in their site plan measurements and photos of their current grass condition. After removing the existing grass and planting the new plants, they can submit final photos and receipts to Austin Water. Residents will be reimbursed \$1 per square foot up to \$3,000.




