

**RESOLUTION NO.**

**WHEREAS**, on November 5, 2024, a general municipal election was held for the purpose of electing the Mayor and City Council Members (single member districts) for District 2, District 4, District 6, District 7, and District 10; and on the same date a special election was held to present to the voters one proposition (Proposition P) regarding removing an area from the City’s extraterritorial jurisdiction, and voters were given the option of voting “for” or “against” the proposition; and

79 canvassed reflect the votes cast at the election; and

80 The Council accepts and approves the returns for the special election, as  
81 tabulated and received and canvassed, and declares that Proposition P passed; and

82 With this canvass, Council is making official the precinct returns received  
83 from the counties.
