1. Approve the minutes of the Austin City Council special called of February 4, 2025, work session of February 11, 2025 and regular meeting of February 13, 2025.

2. Authorize negotiation and execution of an interlocal agreement with Harris County for the City to receive an amount not to exceed \$31,593,683 for participation in the Solar for All Program, as administered by Harris County through a grant by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, for the term of March 27, 2025, through the grant period ending August 31, 2029. Funding: \$31,593,683 has been allocated starting in the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Austin Energy Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund. No match is required from the City.

3. Approve an ordinance amending City Code Chapter 15-9 (Utility Service Regulations) to authorize wastewater billing methodology for customers with onsite water reuse systems and customers with evaporative loss from cooling towers. Funding: This item has no fiscal impact.
