LAUNDRY: A LUXURY A NECESSITY

Clean clothes open doors to **health, dignity, and opportunity**. Reliable laundry access helps families feel *safe, supported, and seen*.

Public Health:
Dirty clothes contribute to fungal infections and respiratory issues.

Social Impact:
Children face bullying and stigma, often skipping school to avoid embarrassment.

Inequity:
Black and Brown communities are hit hardest by limited, unsafe, or broken laundromat facilities.



ECONOMIC & PUBLIC SAFETY IMPACT

The impact of clean clothes is clear; Especially when the hardship affects your ability to show up in the most important settings. The effects are not standalone events or isolated feelings. They start to affect those around us too.



IMPOSSIBLE CHOICES

Families are forced to choose between gas, food, or clean clothes, increasing economic instability.



ABSENTEEISM

Lack of clean uniforms leads to school absenteeism and youth disengagement.



CITY COSTS

Job instability and preventable health problems eventually become city costs.

There was an overwhelming need that drove us to serve **more** families in Travis County.

THE FUNDING GAP

Budget Cuts: Pilot program funding ended Dec 31st due to APH cuts.

Rising Costs: Laundry costs have surged from \$5 to nearly \$8 per load.

No Options: Without sustainable funding, many families are left with nowhere to turn.

Observations

- The NEED for laundry services does not end at our program conclusion or funding period.
- This was particularly observed through our traditional on-site laundry services.

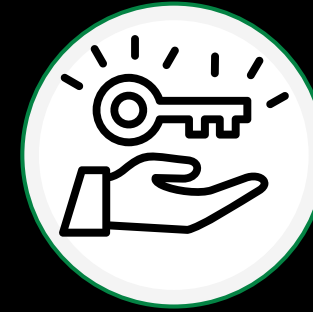
