

## REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL:

Austin, Texas, February 26, 1931.

The Council was called to order by the Mayor. Roll call showed the following members present: Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; absent, none.

The regular order of business was suspended for the opening of bids on street paving, in accordance with advertised notice of same, and the following bids were opened and read:

L. E. Whitham & Co.;  
Brown & Root;  
Southwest Bitulithic Co.

The above bids were then referred to H. R. F. Helland, Consulting Engineer, for tabulation and report to the Council.

The Minutes of the last meeting were read and Councilman Pannell moved the adoption of same as read. Motion was seconded by Councilman Mueller and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

Mrs. L. O. Chilton appeared before the Council and asked for a reduction in the valuation placed on her property in Evergreen Heights and gave reasons why same was overassessed. Councilman Pannell moved that the matter be referred to the Tax Department and C. P. Ledbetter for investigation and report to the Council. Motion was seconded by Councilman Mueller, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

This being the day set for the hearing of owners of abutting property and others interested with reference to street improvements to be constructed in the certain Units or Districts of Improvement as follows:

ALLEY IN BLOCK 134 from Lavaca Street to Guadalupe Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-75;

ALLEY IN BLOCK 149 between Lavaca Street and Guadalupe Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-76;

ALLEY IN BLOCK 157 between Lavaca Street and Guadalupe Street, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-77;

ALLEY IN BLOCK 175 between Guadalupe Street and West Avenue, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-78;

WEST HALF OF ALLEY IN OUTLOT 38, DIVISION "E" between Guadalupe Street and a point 138 feet east, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-79;

ALLEY IN OUTLOT 35, DIVISION "E" between Lavaca and Guadalupe Streets, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-80;

ALLEY IN BLOCK 112 between Brazos and San Jacinto Streets, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-82;

EAST HALF OF ALLEY IN BLOCK 122 from San Jacinto Street to a point 128 feet west, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-83;

ALLEY IN BLOCK 20, L. HORST ADDITION, DIVISION "D" between Nineteenth and Twentieth Streets, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-102;

ALLEY IN BLOCK 21, L. HORST ADDITION, DIVISION "D" between Twentieth and Twenty-first Streets, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-103;

ALLEY IN BLOCK 67 between San Jacinto and Trinity Streets, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-105;

ALLEY IN BLOCK 113 between San Jacinto and Trinity Streets, known and designated as Unit or District No. P-106;

the Mayor thereupon stated that all persons desiring to protest against the levying of assessments against abutting property on the above mentioned alleys and within the limits above stated, or who desired to be heard with reference to the improvements

proposed to be assessed against said property and the owners thereof, the lien and liability thereof, the special benefits to the property and the owners thereof, or any other matters or things authorized by the provisions of Article XXIV of the Charter of the City of Austin to be urged and considered at this hearing, would now be heard from, and thereupon the following protests were heard:

Alley in Block 157 between Lavaca Street and Guadalupe Street:

Miss Susie Meyer stated that she was not financially able to pay for the paving at this time;

Alley in Outlot 35, Division "D" between Eighteenth and Nineteenth Streets and Lavaca and Guadalupe Streets:

J. W. Hawkins and Joe S. Wooten, by written protest, stated that there was no demand for the paving of this alley, and to do so would be a confiscation of the adjacent property owners' money without due return in revenue or enhancement in value of the property;

Alley in Block 20, L. Horst Addition, Division "D" between Nineteenth and Twentieth Streets:

Burt Brydson stated that the paving would not enhance the value of the property; that in his judgment Whitis Avenue instead of the alley should be paved;

Alley in Block 21, L. Horst Addition, Division "D" between Twentieth and Twenty-First Streets:

Fred Becker, Agent, J. E. Ponton, R. C. Wilde, Mrs. J. J. Terrell, Burt Brydson, Mrs. A. E. Stelfox, and Horace Barnhart, by written protest submitted by said Horace Barnhart, objected to paving of above alley unless necessary storm sewer were laid to take care of large amount of drain water.

No other property owners or interested persons appearing to be heard, the Mayor thereupon laid before the Council the following ordinance:

Motion was seconded by Councilman Pannell, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

The ordinance was read the second time and Councilman Mueller moved a further suspension of the rule and the placing of the ordinance on its third reading. Motion was seconded by Councilman Pannell, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

The ordinance was read the third time and Councilman Mueller moved that same be finally passed. Motion was seconded by Councilman Pannell, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following ordinance:

The above ordinance was read the first time and Councilman Mueller moved a suspension of the rule and the placing of the ordinance on its second reading. Motion was seconded by Councilman Pannell, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes,

Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

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The Mayor announced that the hearing of property owners and other interested persons with reference to the improvements to be constructed on the Alley in Block No. 4 between First and Second Streets from Colorado to Lavaca Streets, District F-65, and sundry other alleys, which was continued from the last regular meeting, would now be opened. No one appearing to be heard, the Mayor then laid before the Council the following ordinance:

Motion was seconded by Councilman Pannell, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays none.

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The Mayor laid before the Council the following ordinance for the second reading:

ORDINANCE MAKING APPROPRIATIONS.  
TO PAY THE CITY OF AUSTIN'S PART  
OF THE COST OF STREET IMPROVEMENTS  
TO BE CONSTRUCTED BY SOUTHWEST BIT-  
ULITHIC COMPANY UPON PORTIONS OF  
EAST AVENUE AND A PORTION OF WEST  
TWENTY-FOURTH STREET IN THE CITY  
OF AUSTIN, TEXAS.

The above ordinance was read the second time and Councilman Mueller moved a suspension of the rule and the placing of the ordinance on its third reading. Motion was seconded by Councilman Pannell, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

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The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution:

WHEREAS, development of business property on West Seventh Street, between Congress Avenue and Colorado Street, has brought about a necessity for renumbering the premises abutting the north and south sides of said West Seventh Street; and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has made a study of the situation and prepared a map showing the recommended scheme of numbering said premises and said map has been reviewed by the City Council;

Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the premises abutting the north and south sides of West Seventh Street shall be numbered in accordance with the recommended house numbers shown on the plat hereto attached marked 2-C-384, which plat is hereby made a part of this resolution.

The above resolution was adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution:

WHEREAS, Texas Public Service Company has presented to the City Council tentative maps or plans showing the proposed construction of its gas mains in the streets in the City of Austin hereafter named, and said maps or plans have been considered by the City Council; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That Texas Public Service Company be and the same is hereby permitted to lay and construct its gas mains in and upon the following streets:

(1) A 4-inch low pressure gas main in Red River Street beginning at a point 18 feet south of and 15 feet west of the intersection of the north line of East 45th Street and the center line of Red River Street;

Thence in a northerly direction 15 feet west of and parallel to the center line of said Red River Street, a distance of approximately three blocks to the north corporate limits of the City of Austin.

Said gas main described above shall have a cover of not less than 2½ feet.

The Texas Public Service Company is hereby put upon notice that the City of Austin does not guarantee that the space assigned above is clear from other underground utilities, but is based upon the best records we have at hand, and that the minimum depth stated does not have any reference to the fact that greater depths may be required at special points. When the Texas Public Service Company requires definite information upon the ground as to elevations or working points from which to base the location of their assignments they shall apply to the City Engineering Department not less than three (3) days before such information is required. The Texas Public Service Company is further put upon notice that they will be required to bear the expense of repairs or replacement of any underground utility damaged during the construction of lines named in this resolution.

AND THAT wherever pavement is cut in the vicinity of a fire plug, water must be used at intervals during the course of back-filling of the ditches.

THAT the work and laying of said gas mains, including the excavation in the streets and the restoration and maintenance of said streets after said mains have been laid, shall be under the supervision and direction of the City Manager, and under all the pertinent terms and conditions of the certain franchise granted to said company by the City of Austin.

The above resolution was adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

THAT the Director of Finance be and he is hereby authorized and directed to destroy, by cremation in the City Hall furnace, the following numbered and otherwise described cancelled bonds, together with sundry cancelled coupons, all of which have been

paid by the City of Austin, and said payment duly recorded on its bond registers and other books of account;

The report of T. B. Trotter Company of an examination of the books of the City for the year 1930 was received and filed.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE STORAGE AND HANDLING OF GASOLINE AND OTHER VOLATILE LIQUIDS; PROHIBITING THE ERECTION, CONSTRUCTION, BUILDING, MAINTENANCE, OR OPERATION OF GASOLINE FILLING STATIONS OR EQUIPMENT WITHOUT PERMIT THEREFOR; PROHIBITING THE SALE, DELIVERY OR PURCHASE OF GASOLINE FROM TANK WAGONS OR OTHER MOVABLE TANKS EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN THIS ORDINANCE; PROHIBITING THE USE OF CERTAIN STREETS BY TANK WAGONS OR OTHER PORTABLE TANKS TRANSPORTING GASOLINE OR OTHER VOLATILE LIQUIDS; REGULATING THE USE OF BUILDINGS USED FOR THE STORAGE AND HANDLING OF GASOLINE OR OTHER VOLATILE LIQUIDS WITH REFERENCE TO OTHER OCCUPANCY; PROHIBITING THE ERECTING OR MAINTENANCE OF FILLING STATIONS WITHIN A DESIGNATED DISTANCE OF ANY SCHOOL OR CHURCH; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF ANY PART OF THE ORDINANCE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

The foregoing ordinance was read the first time and laid over.

Councilman Pannell moved that the Council recess until 5:00 o'clock P.M. Motion was seconded by Councilman Steck, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

The Council then recessed.

AFTERNOON SESSION:

The Council met with all members present.

The Mayor laid before the Council the following resolution:

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TEXAS, APPROVING THE BID OF L.E. WHITHAM & COMPANY AND AWARDING THE CONTRACT FOR IMPROVING PORTIONS OF EAST SECOND STREET AND SUNDRY OTHER STREETS IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, AND SETTING ASIDE A FUND TO PAY THE PORTION OF THE COST REQUIRED BY THE TERMS OF SAID CONTRACT TO BE PAID BY THE CITY OF AUSTIN.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That, Whereas, after due advertisement for bids for the improvement of the streets hereinafter set out and the due filing of bids for said work of improvement, the City Council after carefully tabulating and inspecting the said bids is of the opinion that the bid of L. E. Whitham & Company is the lowest and best bid for the improvement of the following streets:

- PAVING DISTRICT #109: East Second Street from the east line of Brazos Street to the west line of Red River Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #110: East Third Street from the east line of Neches Street to the west line of Red River Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #111: East Fourth Street from the east line of Brazos Street to the west line of San Jacinto Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #112: East Fourth Street from the east line of San Jacinto Street to the west line of Red River Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #113: Trinity Street from the north line of First Street to the south line of Third Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #114: Trinity Street from the north line of Third Street to the south line of Fifth Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #115: Neches Street from the north line of First Street to the south line of Third Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #116: Neches Street from the north line of Third Street to the south line of Fifth Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #135: West Avenue from the north line of Thirtieth Street to the south line of Thirty-fourth Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #136: Pearl Street from the north line of Twenty-ninth Street to the south line of Thirtieth Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #137: Thirtieth Street from the west line of West Avenue to the east line of Pearl Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #147: East Seventh Street from the east line of East Avenue to the east line of Waller Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #148: East Seventh Street from the east line of Waller Street to the east line of Comal Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #149: East Seventh Street from the east line of Comal Street to the east line of Chicon Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #150: Chicon Street from the north line of Seventh Street to the north line of Eleventh Street;
- PAVING DISTRICT #151: Chicon Street from the north line of Eleventh Street to the north line of Rosewood Avenue.

PAVING DISTRICT #152: Ohicon Street from the north line of Rosewood Avenue to the north line of Twelfth Street;

PAVING DISTRICT #153: Ohicon Street from the north line of Twelfth Street to the north line of Nineteenth Street;

PAVING DISTRICT #154: Ohicon Street from the north line of Nineteenth Street to the south line of Twenty-third Street.

Each unit or district shall be and constitute an entirely and wholly separate and independent unit of improvement the same as if contracted for in separate and distinct contracts. The construction of said improvements in each separate unit or district shall be wholly independent of the construction in any other unit or district. The assessments to be levied in each unit or district shall be made according to the cost of the improvements in that particular unit or district, and in accordance with the benefits accruing to the property by reason of said improvements in that particular unit or district, wholly and entirely independent of the cost and of the benefits accruing by reason of the improvements in any other unit or district; and, further,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That the bid of L. E. Whitham & Company for the improvement of said streets be and the same is hereby accepted, and that the City Manager and City Clerk are instructed to enter into contract on behalf of the City of Austin with L. E. Whitham & Company for said improvements, in conformity with the terms of their said bid; further,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

That there be and is hereby set aside out of the proceeds of bonds issued and sold for that purpose now on hand available for street improvements a sufficient sum to pay and defray all that portion of the cost of said improvements required by the terms of said contract to be paid by the City of Austin.

That this resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

The above resolution was adopted by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.

PAVING DISTRICT #123: Brazos Street from the north line of Thirteenth Street to the south line of Nineteenth Street;

PAVING DISTRICT #124: Colorado Street from the south line of Fourteenth Street to the south line of Nineteenth Street;

PAVING DISTRICT #125: San Antonio Street from the south line of Ninth Street to the south line of Eleventh Street;

PAVING DISTRICT #126: San Antonio Street from the south line of Eleventh Street to the south line of Twelfth Street;

be accepted as the lowest and best bid, and that the City Manager be authorized to enter into contract with said Southwest Bitulithic Company accordingly. Motion was seconded by Councilman Steck, and same prevailed by the following vote: Ayes, Mayor McFadden, Councilmen Mueller, Pannell, Reed, and Steck, 5; nays, none.
